Looking back, just after I arrived here, Ambassador Urawadee joined "sobamaking (buckwheat noodles)" with me for Japanese food promotion event at the ASEAN Secretariat, making the event a great success. Since then, she has attended so many events and meetings for the 50th Year of ASEAN-Japan Friendship and Cooperation, suggesting ideas and undertaking coordination. This all led to great achievements, such as the Joint Vision Statement and the Implementation Plan. Efforts of Junior High School Students to Address Garbage Problem Junior high-school students ddressing waste issue

For the past year, Year-9 students at the Jakarta Japanese School (JJS) have studied ASEAN, Indonesia, and Japan relations as part of their integrated studies. Last year in April, I gave a <u>lecture</u> and assigned tasks. in September they submitted a <u>proposal and an action declaration</u> to me, and in October they organised exhibitions in four booths at <u>their school festival (JJS Festival)</u>.

On 7 March, as their last activity before graduation, they participated in a SpoGOMI at the Ragunan Zoo in Jakarta. SpoGOMI is a new sport from Japan that adds the essence of "sport" to the traditional trash pickup organised by companies and organizations and switches the "social service" activity into a "competition. Last year, the World Cup for it was held for the first time.

About 40 Year-9 students of the JJS donated <u>handmade trash boxes</u> to representatives of the Ragunan Zoo at the opening ceremony, and then spent an

hour collecting and sorting garbage, working up a good sweat. They were supported by staff members of Marubeni Corporation and Aeon Delight, who have been making great efforts to promote SpoGOMI in Indonesia, such as Jakarta, Bali, and Bandung.

I believe the students of JJS will certainly be of great help in their efforts to strengthen cooperation between ASEAN and Japan, which they proposed and implemented on their own. I will continue to support them after their graduation.

On 22 March, the Graduation Ceremony for the AHA Centre Executive
Leadership in Emergency and Disaster Management Programme (ACE-LEDMP)

Middle Level Course was held. 20 participants from National Disaster
Management Organizations (NDMOs) across ASEAN attended 1-month online
training and another 1-month of face-to-face training in Jakarta and Japan.

At the ceremony, Deputy Secretary General of ASEAN H.E. Nararya and Director of AHA Center Mr. Lee gave their remarks and I also made my <u>remarks</u>. A <u>recap video</u> of all the trainees' messages was played, followed by awarding the certificates of completion. After closing, I asked the trainees about their impressions of the program. They replied that in Japan they visited Tokyo, Saitama and Kobe, exchanged views with disaster management officials both from both public and private sectors, and observed sites of various facilities, for which they expressed their sincere appreciation.

A large earthquake occurred in Ishikawa, Japan, in January this year. I am pleased to know that Japan's expertise in disaster management are widely utilized in ASEAN countries. I feel that this is a great contribution to the region and to the world.

This training program began in 2014, and about 150 people have already participated in the course, while the content continues to be improved. I would like to make every effort to ensure this kind of initiative continues and developes in the future.

ASEAN Startup Ecosystem

On 26 March, I attended the reception for the establishment of the <u>E-DISC (ERIA - Digital Innovation and Sustainable Economy Center)'s Exclusive Membership Programme</u> and made remarks at the outset. E-DISC was launched last year by ERIA in cooperation with Japan.

E-DISC has been working, since its inception in August last year, to create a startup ecosystem to address social challenges in ASEAN. The reception gathered key partners to expand the network of the E-DISC membership

programme. Greetings and presentations were made by President Watanabe Tetsuya of ERIA, Executive Director Ferro Ferizka of <u>Pijar Foundation</u>, Mr Ikenishi Ryo of <u>Japan SEA Innovation Platform (JSIP)</u>, and Mr Ishikawa Hiroshi of JETRO Singapore Office. The event was an opportunity for startup and innovative stakeholders from Indonesia, Japan, and other countries from the industry, government, and academia to interact with each other.

ERIA also has a <u>Call for Proposals: One ASEAN Startup Award 2024</u> to be held three times this year, and the award ceremony scheduled to be held in Laos this October. Through these initiatives, I hope the ASEAN startup ecosystem will grow and develop significantly.

■ Launch of the East Asia Summit (EAS) Group Start of East Asia Summit (EAS) Process

On 26 March, the First Meeting of the Group of East Asia Summit (EAS) Participating Countries' Ambassadors to ASEAN in Jakarta (EAS Group) was held for this year. The EAS is a framework for regional cooperation involving eight countries: Japan, China, Republic of Korea, Australia, New Zealand, India, the United States, and Russia, in addition to 10 ASEAN Member States.

This year, Lao PDR holds the ASEAN Chair, and the preparations for the EAS Summit in Vientiane in October began this time. The meeting also included the promotion of cooperation under the EAS Plan of Action 2024-2028 adopted last year and also covered regional policies and initiatives.

At the EAS Summit held in Jakarta last September, support for mainstreaming and implementing the ASEAN Outlook for the Indo-Pacific (AOIP) was confirmed for the first time in the <u>Leaders' Statement</u> (Para. 33). I would like to make efforts to materialise this, making use of various initiatives launched throughout the 50th Year of ASEAN-Japan Friendship and Cooperation.
