First of all, I would like to take this opportunity to extend our deepest condolences and sympathy to the family of the victims, people and the governments of Myanmar and Thailand, that were affected by the recent earthquake. I sincerely pray for the swift recovery as well as the early restoration of the disaster-stricken areas.

Japan has been providing as much support as possible, including the dispatch of Japan Disaster Relief (JDR) Medical Teams and Japan Self-Defense Forces Aircraft, the provision of Emergency Relief Goods, Emergency Grant, and Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects. We will continue to work closely with Myanmar and Thailand, and ASEAN to overcome this great challenge

together.

(ACE Programme)

A series of ACE LEDMP courses of this cycle started in August in 2023. I would like to congratulate the ACE Middle Level Second Batch participants on their successful completion of the course. With this course, all ACE-LEDMP courses have been completed, and we will now move on to the coordination for the next phase of the programme.

The response to the earthquake this time reminded us that such a major disaster is difficult to deal with by the affected countries alone. Therefore, ASEAN collaboration through the AHA Centre and cooperation with its external partners is the key to a prompt and appropriate response.

The ACE Programme is a project to build the capacity of the promising officials who will play a central role in each country's response to natural disasters. I am pleased and honored that Japan has been supporting this fruitful initiative with ASEAN for such a long time from 2014, with around 200 graduates from 7 batches of ACE programme and ACE-LEDMP.

This was made possible by a long history of cooperation and friendship with mutual respect and understanding over the years.

I believe that your contribution in the future will solidify the foundation for ASEAN's prosperity for the next 20 years as well as ASEAN-Japan cooperation for the next 50 years.
